Parents Right to Know Title I School-Wide Programs

As a parent of a student in the Lake Havasu Unified School District #1, under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, you have a right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. The No Child Left Behind Act gives you the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the State of Arizona has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subject he or she teaches
 - Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status by which state licensing criteria have been waived
 - The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees
 - Whether any instructional aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications

Message from Health Office Caring For Scorpion Weed Rash

- Identify whether the child actually came in contact with the weed or if a pet brought it in. If it was a pet he can carry it on his fur and spread it to humans. The critter needs a bath.
- If the child was out in the weeds or in the desert, peel off the clothes so the outside doesn't come in contact with their skin.
- If someone has been outside and in possible contact, be sure their skin is washed thoroughly as soon as they come in the house.
- Don't use alcohol to try to dry it out, it makes it itch worse.
- Benadryl caps or tabs can be helpful but in young children it may make them hyper, best to use at night
- Aveeno baths can be helpful
- Hydrocortisone 1% is useful up to 3 times a day
- Don't use benadryl cream, they get sensitive to it quickly
- If the blisters become honey crusted, there is swelling or the rash is severe they need to be seen by a physician and will likely need steroids.
- It's best not to pop the blisters. If you decide you're going to pop any blisters, be sure to wash the skin first. If you don't wash the skin, the fluid from the blister can spread the irritation.

TAX CREDIT

The Tax Credit Program Keep Tax Dollars in Havasu! Call 928-505-6917 for more information.

When you participate in the tax credit program the State of Arizona allows you to get a DOLLAR FOR DOLLAR subtraction from your State income tax and your tax dollars stay in Havasu at your school for the programs you choose. You may participate up to \$200 if you are single or up to \$400 if you are married and get the tax credit.

Nautilus Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up

The student drop-off and pick-up system at Nautilus can be effective and safe if everyone follows the procedures! The following are procedures should be used for the system to run effectively!

- Students may be dropped off at **ANY** point on the "green curb" sidewalk. Please **do not** wait to be first in the "green curb" line to drop them off.
- Once your student(s) have been dropped off in the right lane, drivers should pull into the left lane and continue on their way. This allows other drivers to pull forward to the green curb.
- No doors should be opened on the driver's side of the vehicle in the drop off lanes.
- If the student cannot open the door from the inside of the vehicle, parents should park in the parking lot along the sidewalk to help the student.
- Parents planning to have breakfast or go inside the school with their student should park in the other rows of the parking lot.
